Host Tip #1

Pre-Production

Research, invite, schedule, prep, confirm.

"Be prepared!!!!"

Boss Tools

Calendly - scheduling HelloSign - talent release Gmail template or Canned Response

Have a standard process!

Host Tip #2

Pre-Production

Treat your space.

Test your tech.

Redundant recording. Redundant recording.

Wired ethernet connection or dedicated wifi.

Boss Tools

ANY microphone except your onboard laptop mic & closed ear headphones

Recording device (Zoom family) or software (Ecamm) or both!

Audio isolation shield and/or small, soft quiet space

Host Tip #3

Production

As if you were inviting your guest into your home...

Be on time. Be gracious.

Help them relaaaaax.

Let them know what to expect.

Do not disturb. Silence notifications. Airplane mode.

Host Tip #4

Production

Ask the right questions!
Who? What? When? Where? Why? How?

Get the story

And then what happened? How did that make you feel?

Have a plan AND go with the flow!

Silence is golden.

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Host Tip #5 Post-Production

Do EVERYTHING you can to make your guest look, sound, feel AMAZING!

Editing - split tracks, noise, levels, content, um...

Promo - make it EASY for guest to share

& easy for listeners to find

Guest Tip #1

Pre-Production

Schedule, listen, prep, confirm, ask questions.

Send the host whatever she needs (photo, bio, etc)

"Be prepared!!!!"

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Boss Questions

Audio or video?

Editing? (you can tell by listening)

Audience? (to whom am I speaking & how can I serve them?)

Estimated release date?

Policies on promo?

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Guest Tip #2 Pre-Production

Treat your space - small, soft, quiet

Test your tech - ALWAYS use headphones & a microphone (at the VERY least earbuds with attached mic)

Wired ethernet connection or dedicated wifi.

Guest Tip #3

Production

Be on time. Be gracious.

Do whatever you need to be relaxed, alert and present.

Do not disturb. Silence notifications. Airplane mode.

Guest Tip #4

Production

Have talking points AND listen so you can respond conversationally.

Tell stories, not just facts.

Keep the audience in mind.

Remember to breathe.

Guest Tip #5 Post-Production

Do EVERYTHING you can to make your HOST look, sound, feel AMAZING!

Promote your episode!
Tag the host or show (note to hosts, make this easy!)
